

Speaking Worksheet: Adjectives

Part A: Mystery Object Game

1. **Choose an object** in the classroom without telling your partner.
2. Describe the object using adjectives (color, size, shape), and let your partner guess what it is!
 - Example: “It’s **small, blue,** and **round.**”
3. Take turns to guess each other’s objects.

Part B: Adjective Bingo!

1. Each student fills in a Bingo card with adjectives like **tall, big, red, happy, short, cold, old, funny** (teacher can provide cards or let students make their own).
2. Walk around the classroom and find classmates who match these adjectives.
3. For example, ask: “Are you **tall**?” If they say “Yes,” you can mark it off. Try to get Bingo!

Part C: Describe Your Superhero!

1. Imagine you have a superhero friend.
2. Describe their appearance and personality to your partner using adjectives.
 - Example: “My superhero is **strong, brave,** and **fast.** He has a **big** cape and **shiny** boots.”
3. Your partner can ask questions to learn more about your superhero, like “Is your superhero funny?”

Part D: Opposite Adjective Challenge

With a partner, play the Opposite Adjective Challenge:

1. One person says an adjective, and the other quickly says the opposite.
 - **Example:** big/small, happy/sad, young/old, loud/quiet.
2. Keep going as fast as you can—see how many you can get in one minute!

Part E: Describe Your Dream Room

1. Imagine your dream bedroom! Describe it to your partner using adjectives about color, size, and feelings.
 - Example: “My room is **bright** and **cozy**. I have a **soft** bed and **blue** walls. It feels very **happy**.”
2. After you both share, draw your dream rooms and add labels to practice your adjectives!

Bonus Activity: Color Hunt

Find objects in the classroom that match certain colors or sizes and describe them to your partner.

- **Example:** “I found a **green** book,” or “This is a **big** chair.”
- Take turns describing items, using as many adjectives as you can!
